Discounted H2O'Brien Pool Passes Available through April

Are you getting excited for summer? Get a head start on fun in the sun with the H2O'Brien Pool Season Pass Special.

Now through April 30, discounted Single passes are \$60/resident and \$70/non-resident and Couples passes are \$120/resident and \$130/non-resident. Families of three are \$150/resident and \$160/non-resident, families of four are \$180/resident and \$190/non-resident and families of five are \$210/resident and \$220 non-resident. Each additional family member is \$30. Annual and sixmonth membership holders of the Parker Recreation Center and Parker Fieldhouse may purchase an add-on pool pass at a discounted rate.

Season passes are good for unlimited admission all summer and may be purchased at the Recreation Center, 17301 E. Lincoln Ave., or at the Fieldhouse, 18700 E. Plaza Drive. H2O'Brien Pool opens for the 2018 season on May 26 (weather permitting) and will be open through Labor Day (weekends-only starting Aug. 20.) Adopt a Flowerbed this Summer

The Parks and Recreation Department is excited to continue the Adopt-a-Flowerbed program, which encourages public involvement in the enhancement of community parks and facilities. This volunteer-based activity allows area volunteer groups to "adopt" and maintain designated flowerbeds in Parker.

Flowerbeds may be adopted by individuals or groups, but participants must commit to one complete growing season of May through September. With direction and oversight from the knowledgeable Parks staff, volunteers will be responsible for keeping the flowerbed free from trash and weeds, ensuring good health of plant material, planting and relocating flowers, installing Town-provided mulch and maintaining signage or display boards, if applicable.

Adoptees will provide a great service to the Parker community and will be acknowledged through signage placed by the flowerbed or planter. Volunteer sign-up is on a first-come, first-served basis.

Permanent Medication Collection Box Now in the PD Lobby!

LOCATION: Parker Police Department

In an effort to provide a safe, convenient and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, the Parker Police Department is now a permanent site for a Medication Collection Box. You can now drop off your unused or expired medications in the front lobby of the Parker Police Department.

The Medication Collection Box is available to the public during normal business hours, **Mon - Fri** 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. and Sat - Sun 10 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Can be accepted:

- Prescription medications, including prescribed controlled substances (DEA Schedule II–V).
- Over-the-counter medications.
- Liquid medications (small amounts in original, non-leaking containers).
- Medicated patches (<u>Used</u> Fentanyl and Duragesic® patches are extremely hazardous. They may be folded in half, sticky-side together, and flushed down the toilet.)
- Medication samples.
- Medicated ointments.
- Vitamins.
- Pet medications.
- Unused drug injection cartridges, e.g. unused EpiPens® and insulin pens (<u>must be unused</u> with needle still protected inside).
- Unused inhaler canisters, e.g. Advair®, Spiriva®, ProAir® and Ventolin® (<u>must be</u> unused, no empty canisters or unneeded plastic holders/mouth pieces).

Cannot be accepted:

- Marijuana.
- Illicit drugs (e.g. DEA Schedule I drugs like heroin, LSD, etc).
- Needles, syringes, and other sharps.
- Chemotherapy drugs.
- Medical tools and supplies.
- Bloody or infectious waste.
- Personal care products.
- Thermometers.
- Empty containers.
- Medication wastes generated by health care facilities, including nursing homes.

Take the 'My Mainstreet' Site Uses Survey

Have you joined the conversation at www.LetsTalkParker.org? We have had hundreds of community members provide feedback on the My Mainstreet project so far, but we still need to hear from you!

This project, a community effort to encourage the right growth in the right places in downtown Parker, will feature many chances for you to provide feedback on how to keep downtown Parker a place we can all be proud to call "My Mainstreet."

The current engagement opportunity available is a survey that allows you to identify the types of commercial uses that you would prefer to see on four publicly owned, downtown mixed-use sites. The survey provides the opportunity to select from general use categories which are outlined in the Parker Mainstreet Master Plan. The survey also asks for your "big ideas" for each site. If you aren't able to share your thoughts online at LetsTalkParker.org, we will be setting up an area where you can fill out the survey in person in Town Hall in the coming days.

The information gathered in this survey will be used as a first step to find consensus on general use categories between what the community envisions and an economic market analysis that is currently underway.
